It's about a brazillion degrees when I glide into our Remuera store to take stock of the ebullient Jess. "Thank God for the beer chiller!" she guffaws, not because our Sol special has whetted her appetite, but because it's the best place to be cool. This one's a wine girl from way back.

Way back when is Ledgewood, New Jersey, home to neither Springsteen, Bon Jovi nor the Sopranos, but the location of a very standard liquor store where Jess moved pallets rather than palates. "We specialised in nasty cask wine and beer," she says; yet it proved to be an unlikely but fertile ground.

"The manager gave me a bottle of wine one night - he was right into his wines, even though we didn't sell any - and said to me, 'drink this, it will change your life.' I did." And it did. A Californian Cabernet that opened her palate and, ultimately, her horizons. "My mother worked at Barnes & Noble and I just went straight in there and bought every book on wine I could." An instant passion, and as we all know, a passion truly followed can take you anywhere. Fast forward a year or two and...

From Ledgewood to helping out doing a vintage at Sacred Hill?

"To be honest, it was only a bit of a vintage, and I have never worked so hard in my life." While the experience cemented in Jess her suspicion that she preferred drinking wine to making it, she says it gave her a great appreciation of what actually goes into the good stuff. "Whenever I drink a bottle of wine, I just think of the thousands of hours of work by so many people that have gone into it. It makes you see everything differently."

Her main interests being in tasting and education, Jess is the hearty host of Friday and Saturday afternoon instore tastings, and judging by the solid number of sippers that come through from late afternoon, it would seem that her regulars like the idea too.

"Everyone has a glass and wanders around, and we just talk about the wine as they go. Retail is the perfect environment for me. I really do just want the perfect wine for my customers."

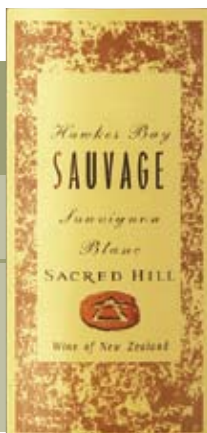

Tawhiri

Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc 2008

Classic Marlborough

Straight off the front foot, with driving green grass/asparagus/canned peas aromas, as you'd expect. Being an Awatere wine accounts for the hint of flint and sea breeze, but the style, Kyle, is Internationally Renowned Marlborough all the way. The natural acid has dialled back a tad; overall she's softened up since we last got together, but not too much, mind. The finish swings back around on you, the overpowering herbaceousness folding into the rest of the wine on the palate beautifully.

Taylor's Eighty Acres

Clare Valley Cabernet Shiraz Merlot 2007

Lush, plush, rich red blend

The newest range from Taylors, the 80 acres referring to the first vineyard block planted by Bill Taylor the year man landed on the moon. The Clare Valley's long ripening period means the flavours concentrate in the grapes to intensity, delivering insane plum and blackberry notes with sprinkles of Shiraz spice, while the merlot accounts for the chocolate. Plush and soft, you kinda sink into the wine as it carries lushly onwards to a rich, dark, mysterious end. Just like life.

Fresh, lively as a lamb, gamine as a gazelle, frisky even, and cutely stylish. Spain's Next Top Model.

Brookfields Bergman

Hawke's Bay Chardonnay 2008

Based in Marlborough, Fromm's signature wines are Pinot Noirs. Right from the start, Fromm's approach was different. When Swiss founder Georg Fromm arrived in the region, he stated that his intention was to specialise in red wines rather than produce yet another Sauvignon Blanc.

Located in a range of districts, The Fromm vineyards encompass a variety of soil types and aspects. They are all close-planted and meticulously managed on organic and biodynamic principles.

Today, Georg's friend Hätsch Kalberer is the driving force behind the Fromm and La Strada wines. Also from Switzerland, Hätsch is an intuitive winemaker and very much influenced by the old world approach.

'Our wines are produced from intensely grown, healthy grapes that are fine tuned in the vineyard, so in the winery we use a minimal approach and allow the wines to make themselves, more or less. Our aim is to make wines that are more textural, more subtle and a true reflection of their terroir.'

The Fromm range boasts handcrafted, long keeping wines produced to express the unique character of their terroir, while the wines marketed under the La Strada label are typically approachable when young, with the emphasis on variety and region. Without exception, all of them are outstandingly individual.



La Strada Marlborough Rosé 2009

Fresh summer fruit flavours

La Strada's rosé blend varies slightly from year to year, depending on the result of the vintage. This release is dominated by Pinot Noir with portions of Syrah and Malbec, the grapes macerated for a short period to extract colour, the juice bled and fermented as if it were a white wine to preserve freshness. Strawberry aromas with a touch of spice and mineral, summer fruit flavours and a fresh, tingly character.



La Strada Marlborough Pinot Noir 2007

Selected from two Brancott Valley vineyards, Fromm's Chardonnay was barrel fermented on indigenous yeasts and matured in French oak. It is a bright, healthy, straw-coloured wine with a well integrated nose of mineral-edged stonefruit and citrus supported by mealy notes and some understated oak. The palate is characterized by ripe peach flavours and buttery nuances, balanced by a fine squeeze of lime. It is a richly-textured wine with an elegant, creamy finish.

Classy, food-friendly Pinot Noir

A very attractive, deep and glossy, dark red Pinot Noir with a tinge of purple highlights leading onto a fragrant nose that's alive with nuances of cherry plum and spice. With a decent period of bottle aging now behind it, this is very much an approachable and food-friendly wine. The palate is well proportioned and harmonious, with good depth of berryfruit flavours embellished by some subtle herb and spice notes. The fine tannins provide grip, textural mouthfeel and length to the finish.

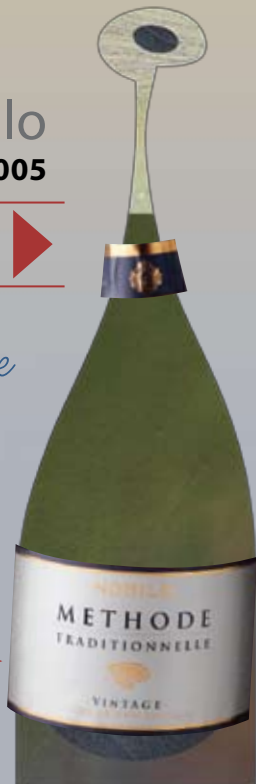

Farmers Market



The antics of the nation's viticulturists don't tend to drive Brad & Ang off the front covers, but as the term 'terroir' gets bandied about with greater frequency, we're all getting more of an understanding of the folk who fix the Scott Henry trellis systems. The Farmers Market Wine Company is built around a group of key viticulturists, tenders of premium vineyard sites who work closely with FMWC winemakers to deliver wines that perfectly express their prime sites. Big, unheralded names making excellent, egalitarian-priced wine.

Farmers Market Gisborne Chardonnay 2009

A pretty little balance of fruit and dairy, stonefruit steered seductively through cream and butter in a feat of textural triumph. Ant Moore



This canny Australian has the pragmatism and drive of the new breed. Responsible for building the Central Otago Vintners winery site in Cromwell, Moore also founded his own labels, Catalina and Crowded House, prior to his eponymous debut. Market-led rather than production-driven, the label is the meeting-point of practicality and perfectionism; 'I planted these vines, tended them, and harvested the fruit to produce these handcrafted wines,' he says of his Sauvignon. Just your typically obsessive wine type, I'd say.

This is that new breed again; people with investment lolly who take their time to get the details right - the site, the peeps, the wines they intend producing - and then harness the talent and the energy and go for it.

Misha's Vineyard Limelight Central Otago Riesling 2008

As with all of the New Kids, though, much time is put into seeking out sites, securing the best vineyard land and cherry-picking the top talent, so that when those wines are released, the pump is primed to handle, and build on, the extraordinary success.

The Searles (jnr) returned from overseas to the family vineyard, where Ma & Pa Searle have toiled triumphantly for some years and, well, you know the young, itching to leave home, aren't they... so Kirsten and Richard took that precipitous step into Own-Label-Ville. They get the anxiety, we get the goods. Ever reminding us that Gisborne is not yet on the lay-by of the wine highway, either.

Brunton Road Gisborne Chardonnay 2008

MATAWHERO



Matawhero was big when everyone had mobiles the size of Rodney Hide's old jackets and the stockmarket was more reliable than Bonus Bonds, so it's a delight that the Searle family have breathed some life into the moribund marvel, while we can safely leave our bulky accoutrements behind in the haze. Originally established by the Irwin family, Matawhero blazed a path of uncompromising vision and energy, a pioneering yet sinewy track that the Searles will now continue into a much fresher decade.

Matawhero Gisborne Sauvignon Blanc 2009

A stimulating but not overpowering wild-herb-meets-wet-straw nose, some lifted pineapples and stonefruit and plenty of powered-up flavour. A smooth, round middle, like Crunchy the Clown, though its outsides are a tad less garish. Hawke's Bay-esque, and a touch more refined than most. Excellent.

COUPER'S SHED



Winemaker Tony Robb was once in IT, so he knows all about working in confined spaces with inappropriate contents. Like sheds. Originally Sydney wine merchants, the Taylor family became involved in winemaking in 1969, when Bill Taylor Snr established a vineyard & winery at Auburn in South Australia's Clare Valley. Today, several members of the family are actively involved in running the company under the leadership of Mitchell Taylor, a qualified winemaker and grandson of Bill Snr.

The original vineyard site was chosen for its cool climate and red-brown loam over limestone. The initial plantings consisted of 178 hectares, with 149 hectares devoted to Cabernet Sauvignon. In 1973, the first estate-grown and bottled Cabernet Sauvignon won a gold medal in every wine show in Australia, and almost every vintage since has continued the tradition.

The vineyard holdings have been greatly expanded since 1969, and the wine styles include both red and white varietals marketed under several individual ranges. During the excavation of the original vineyard dam, Bill and his sons uncovered the fossilized remains of sea horses (known as 'Jaraman' in aboriginal), the inspiration for a range of premium varietal wines that are superbly expressive of their unique Clare Valley terroir.

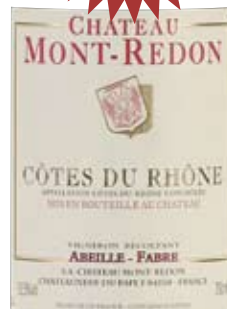

The wines of Bierzo

Generally unheard of a decade ago, the region of Bierzo has emerged as one of Spain's wine hotspots, but like most emerging Spanish wine regions, is hardly new, having produced wine since Roman times.

The Bierzo DO is located in a hollow surrounded by mountains to the west and north. Sheltered by the mountains, yet influenced by the Atlantic, it is more temperate than other Castilla wine regions and is well-suited to viticulture. The terraced vineyards are located between 500 and 800 metres above sea level, where the soils consist of schist/slate types, while on the valley floors, they tend toward gravels, quartz and clay.

What makes Bierzo wines so distinctive, particularly the reds, are the old vines of the indigenous Mencia variety, which account for 70% of the total plantings. At its best, Mencia wines can produce fruity, aromatic wines with good depth and firm tannins.

As with many other Spanish wine regions, Bierzo is still undergoing a transformation, but as its two leading producers, Dominio de Tares and Descendientes de José Palacios have shown, its wines are world-class.

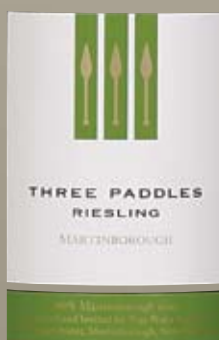
